- * Find an evergreen cone
- * Find tracks in the snow and identify them. What kind are they?
- * Find a hole dug in the snow by an animal looking for food.
- * Look for a twig that has been browsed off by a deer.
- * Find a tree with a buck rub.
- * Locate an animal path worn through the woods.
- * Find brown leaves still hanging from an oak tree.
- * Watch an icicle form.
- * Follow rabbit tracks. Where do rabbits live in the winter?
- * Find a tunnel in the snow made by a mole, mouse or vole.
- * Look for snow fleas on the snow at the base of trees.
- * Watch a chickadee.
- * Find a gall on goldenrod. (Look on the stem for this round bulb created by wasps, flies, beetles or moths.
- * Find a squirrel's nest made of leaves.
